Board has been hard at work throughout the fall and winter making plans for the upcoming season. However, I think the Board was incredibly productive in making improvements—both visible and behind-the-scenes.

The Board, in my opinion, are highly committed and have the same goals as the membership we represent. We all want a pool that is safe for our families to enjoy, clean and neat looking, and fun for every member. Here are a few of the improvements we have made in preparation for the upcoming season:

 In response to suggestions at the 2019 Annual Membership Meeting, a communications chairperson on the Board was designated. This Board member will be primarily responsible for making sure that pool information is communicated to members both electronically and posted at the pool. Jeff Haines, in his first year on the Board, has already put together creative plans for keeping everyone in the know.

- New software was tested over the winter to improve how pool leases and memberships are processed with the intent to reduce paper forms.
- After researching several companies and reviewing proposals, a new two-year contract was signed with Ace Aquatics to remain as our pool management company. The contract keeps intact all of our current opening and closing times and the number of lifeguards working.
- Additional funds were allocated to a capital improvement fund in our budget. This fund allows the Board to plan for anticipated costs of making physical improvements to the pool and buildings proactively, instead of when they break. The fund supported the new pool deck last year and will be used for planned electrical improvements this year.

It's time to start picking out your favorite swimsuit. The 2020 pool season will kick off Memorial Day weekend and *it's going to be a great pool season!* See you at the pool!



Policies and Management Changes

The CSCSC Board would like to welcome all our members to another fun-filled summer at our wonderful facility. We are excited to see everyone again!

As we get ready to open the pool, I would like to take a minute to explain what took place during the off-season and point out some important policy reminders.

The team has been busy reviewing, communicating, and researching members' concerns and ways of improving our facilities. One such endeavor was the review of our pool management contract. After months of talks and contract negotiations with several companies, we are excited to inform you that we will continue our partnership with Ace Aquatics (formerly DRD). They have worked with us to revamp their service and save us over ten thousand dollars over the next two years, without compromising our needs and requirements. We appreciated their patience and willingness to work with us in providing the best experience and service to our members.

Policy Reminders

- The pool will open Saturday, May 23, and hold daily swimming hours from 11 a.m. to 8:45 p.m. (patrons will be asked to exit the pool 15 minutes prior to closing at 9 p.m.).
- The pool is private property and there is no entry outside of posted hours.
- Please be respectful to the guards and follow their guidance. If you have a concern with a guard, please bring it to the attention of a Board member, or contact us at info@capepool.com.

- All persons using the pool agree to abide by the regulations listed, and any additional rules posted and administered by the manager/staff. They further agree to accept the penalties for the infraction of those rules and regulations.
- No abusive/profane language or breach of the peace will be tolerated.
- Please make sure you clean up your areas before departing.
- Parents are responsible for the safety and behavior of their children when using the pool facilities.
- In the diving well, general swimming and game playing is permitted only when the diving board is not in use.

The full rules are posted on our website at capepool.com/rules. These rules will also be posted at the entrance of the pool.

Membership Updates

To meet the needs and scale of our membership in 2020, all dues and payments have been transitioned online to our secure payment site, Member Splash, linked from the navigation at capepool.com under Membership, and then Member Login. A ~3.5% service fee is added to all online payments.

Following is an updated summary of dues requirements and membership options. For complete information, visit capepool.com/join.

Pay Your Dues Online before April 1

Club bylaws require your household's annual dues of \$600 to be remitted online on or before April 1, 2020. After April 10, 2020, a late fee of \$50 will be assessed, as well as an additional fee of \$50 on the first day of each subsequent month that your dues have not been paid.

To pay, simply:

- 1. Visit capepool.com
- 2. Select *Membership* from the navigation, and then *Member Login*
- 3. Use your email of record and password to log in to Member Splash, our secure payment site
- 4. Please review (and update if necessary) your family information before you make your payment
- 5. You should see a banner that says, "Your account is not paid..." Click the *HERE* link to proceed
- 6. Select the \$600 dues payment. You may also purchase guest passes or a babysitter card
- 7. Select the payment method radio button, and click *Next*
- 8. Fill out your payment information, and click Submit order
- You will receive a .pdf invoice as a record of your payment at your email address of record

Guest and Babysitter Passes

Guest passes are \$5 each. Each guest between the ages of 2 and 60 requires one pass per visit.

Members under 10 years of age who are not otherwise accompanied and supervised by a member or leasee age 13 or older or a guest grandparent will only be admitted with a babysitter who must be at least 13 years old. A babysitter pass is required for the admittance of non-member babysitters, and may be shared amongst multiple babysitters. Only one babysitter will be admitted per membership per visit. A babysitter pass is \$35.

To order guest passes or a babysitter pass:

- 1. Visit capepool.com
- 2. Select *Membership* from the navigation, and then *Member Login*
- 3. Use your email of record and password to log in to Member Splash, our secure payment site
- 4. Select *Make a Payment* from the menu and complete the proper payment process

Available Memberships & Leases

CSCSC has a handful of outstanding membership bonds available. If you know someone who is interested in purchasing a bond or leasing a membership, please contact info@ capepool.com. They will need to complete the appropriate forms, available at capepool.com/join.

Leasing Your Membership

You must pay your 2020 dues online before leasing your membership. To get started:

- View detailed instructions and download the Membership Lease Agreement (MLA) at capepool.com/join
- 2. Locate a lessee and negotiate your lease price
- 3. Print and complete *Part 1B* of the MLA
- 4. Have the lessee complete the rest of the MLA, provide a written recommendation from a current CSCSC bondholder other than you that is in good standing, and attach their recommendation letter
- 5. Mail the completed MLA and letter to the CSCSC
- 6. No lease is official until approved by the CSCSC Board. The MLA and recommendation will be reviewed before or at the next regularly-scheduled Board

meeting after the agreement is received and a representative will notify you and the lessee of the Board's decision by email. The Board makes every effort to review MLAs as soon as possible.

7. Once approved by the Board, the lessee must submit the \$250 leasing fee online.

Selling Your Membership Bond

We're sorry to see you go! You must pay your 2020 dues online before selling your bond. To get started:

- 1. View detailed instructions and download the Membership Sale Agreement (MSA) at capepool.com/join
- 2. Locate a buyer and negotiate your sale price
- 3. Print and complete Part 1 of the MSA
- Have the buyer complete Part 2 of the MSA, provide a written recommendation from a current CSCSC bondholder other than you that is in good standing, and attach their recommendation letter
- 5. Mail the completed MSA and letter to the CSCSC
- 6. No sale is official until approved by the CSCSC Board. The MSA and recommendation will be reviewed before or at the next regularly-scheduled Board meeting after the agreement is received and a representative will notify you and the buyer of the Board's decision by email. The Board makes every effort to review MSAs as soon as possible.

You may also request that the Board sell your bond for you at the current market rate less sale fees. More information is available at capepool.com/join or by contacting membership@capepool.com.

Cape St. Claire Swim Club offers a variety of Aquatics Services to meet the needs of new and experienced swimmers alike. From our competitive swim program to our beginners' swim class, CSCSC has something for everyone!

Swim Team

The Cape St. Claire Dolphins compete in Division 2 of the Greater Annapolis Swim League (swimgasl.org).

- The season begins right after Memorial Day and runs through the end of July
- Practices are held every weekday, and meets take place Saturday mornings
- Open to member and non-member children
 5–18 who meet all eligibility requirements
- Run by a dedicated senior coaching staff with over a decade of coaching experience at CSCSC
- Our Big Fish, Little Fish Program is a voluntary program that pairs novice and intermediate swimmers to encourage growth, confidence, and team unity
- A volunteer commitment is required of each family who wishes for their child to compete
- All swimmers must attend a swimsuit fitting, date and time to be announced

Not sure if your child is ready to join the Dolphins? Our new, Try It! program might be just what you're looking for. Previously known as our pre-competitive group, Try It! allows swimmers and their families to try swim team without making the full commitment.

- Participants attend the first two weeks of team practice where they will learn through participation and gain a broader understanding of the program
- Upon completion, swimmers may sign up to join the team for the remainder of the season pending the coach's approval
- Available to member and non-member swimmers ages 8 and under
- Try It! swimmers do not participate in meets

- Experienced instructor-led lessons, supported by members of our swim team, encourage confidence and address skills based on student need

- Five Monday–Thursday weekly sessions, sign-up for one or all twenty at a discounted rate
