BoG President Watson introduced the BoG voting process. The candidates present each introduced themselves. President Watson read the bios for candidates who were not present.

The results of the Board of Governors member vote was announced. Five members were elected to the board as officers

Committee Reports President's Remarks

Another great summer at the pool is coming to a close. We started our season off with a few repairs and replacements in the pumphouse and bathrooms, plus new lighting around the pool deck and pavilion. New speakers were installed, the deck was power washed, and a fresh new red line was painted. We invested in new pool furniture and umbrellas. We continue to see a high demand for membership, which is great for the continued health of our swim club. Mid-season we ran into an issue with our Google

domain, and thanks to the hard work of our Vice President, Jeff, we were able to pivot to a new domain.

It is important to look toward the future of our club and plan for capital improvements and upgrades. There are many aging areas around the facility that need to be addressed by future boards. It is suggested for the next board to create a long term strategic plan that will account for the various capital improvements and upgrades that will arise within the next decade. Additionally, the next board should consider raising dues to cover annual landscaping and deck maintenance costs that have previously been covered by volunteer hours or left undone. These tasks are manageable with planning and action, and will allow our swim club to be enjoyed for generations to come.

Vice President's Report

Management Company

- Our three-year contract with Ace Aquatics, alongside which they gave us a one-year, interest-free, \$20K loan that helped finance the bonding of the pool electrical in 2021, runs through 2024
- We are one of very few fully-staffed pools this summer, and should be able to remain open for normal hours through Labor Day
- Guards continue to voice concerns that they are overworked and underpaid
- With only one Pool Operator-certified guard working at a time and three guards often sitting due to high bather load, "all-clears" frequently cancelled out Adult Swim breaks
- Costs will continue to increase year-over-year per our contract and when we look for a new one, but we have expanded the membership of the club to the carrying capacity of the pool and deck

Main (MP) and Wading (WP) Pools

- The MP pump burned out in the spring and was replaced with a state-of-the-art, variable speed pump
- Our high-end but defective diving board (purchased in 2022) was replaced by the manufacturer
- Chlorinator and chlorine reservoir issues with both pools were resolved
- Water quality has been very good throughout the season
- Partnered with President to power wash deck prior to season opening
- Both pools are largely in very good shape

General, At-Large Topics

- Secured new TLD and migrated over Google Workspace and website
- Guard shack/bathhouse continues to age and have numerous issues (structural, electrical, plumbing)
- We are not maximizing the use of our premises
- Extremely high demand for memberships
- Recommended increasing the Membership Fee at least \$200 (Board approved \$250 increase in August)
- Struggled to get member volunteers throughout the year

Actions for Next Year

- We need to maintain our pipeline of community-based lifeguards. Look into subsidizing the cost of training and marketing the opportunity to high schoolers
- Determine if and for which days and times we scale to a four-guard pool and negotiate cost with Ace
- Deck drains need are clogged and need to be cleaned
- The 2023 Board recommends having the sand in all three MP filters replaced prior to opening for 2024
- Get bids from multiple management companies amd sign contract for 2025+
- Collaborate to build five- and ten-year plans for the club with a focus on improving facilities and amenities and covering management costs

Treasurer's Report

2022 Financial Results

Going into 2022, we owed \$20,000 to Ace Aquatics for 2021 repairs. In order to pay for this and recover from the other massive amount of repairs and other operating issues from 2020 and 2021 the Board of Governors voted to increase fees for 2022. This included increasing our annual dues from \$600 to \$650, increasing babysitting passes from \$35 to \$100 and increasing guest passes from \$5 to \$7. This decision was made after analyzing other pools in the area and what our financial needs will be moving forward. In addition to paying off debt, these increases will assist in preparing for issues that may arise in the future as well as increased costs. Our contract with Ace calls for incremental increases over the next couple of years (mostly due to the increase in minimum wage). We paid for all the outstanding debt in April 2022. Our 2022 approved budget included paying off debt and investing in new speakers and lap lanes.

The club's cash balance was strong going into 2022 was \$42,649. This is compared to \$124,421 in the beginning of 2021. We finished the 2022 pool season strong. At the end of the season, we exceeded our budget by \$60,000. The Board of Governors voted to transfer \$10,000 into our capital improvement fund. They also approved purchasing new furniture (10 new lounge chairs, 6 new umbrellas and stands). We also purchased large storage containers for aquatics and new speakers. We ended 2022 with \$51,660 cash on hand.

2023 Financial Results

Going into 2023, we were in a strong financial position. We have \$23,000 in our capital improvement fund (adding \$10,000 in 2022). We allocated \$18,000 in our 2023 budget for repairs and other improvements. We have had various expenses for plumbing, electric and pumps. We also had a structural engineer evaluate the retaining wall. We also spent approximately \$1200 to repair the chair lift.

As of July 31, 2023, our cash on hand was 121,000. We still have a month left of the season, but anticipate being in a strong position after the season is over. The Board of Governors has discussed continuing to allocate excess funds to the capital improvement fund as well as prioritizing other repairs that are needed.

Buildings and Grounds Report

The 2023 season brought us another great year of love and care of our beloved pool!

Thanks to the help of our community, we hosted a successful cleanup day pre-opening where we tended to the landscaping, gave the bathrooms a deep clean, and overhauled the pool pump room and guard shack at the entrance, organizing as well as disposing of many old/unwanted items.

A number of items were repaired or replaced such as the fencing around the deck, outdoor speakers, soap dispensers, and ADA chair lift. New deck furniture and umbrellas were added to our fleet and storage bins were replaced and moved off of the deck area to allow more room for seating. A paver walkway was added behind the pump room to allow the guards to better access storage.

New motion lighting was installed around the grounds and parking lot and security cameras were installed.

Next year we hope to continue buildings and ground efforts by adding additional landscaping, repainting, including adding a mural to the retaining wall around the deck, and revamping the volleyball court.

Membership Report

As the club is at 200 membership accounts, no additional Club memberships were made available for sale this past year. We have had 13 approved membership transfers from existing members to new members this year, with the average sale price of \$1585 (after removing one internal family sale of \$350). The Club leased 10 memberships for this season and 9 members privately leased their memberships.

We continue to try to streamline records and systems, and certificates are now only provided in a digital format. Memberships, transfers and leases are all recorded in our Google Drive and a list of all members printed in hard copy each June.

We have over 70 people listed as "Interested to purchase a membership" on our Membership Marketplace and "Interested to Lease" and receive multiple emails from interested parties each week. To keep the lists updated and make the leasing process more transparent, the Google docs for being interested to purchase versus lease on the Marketplace have now been separated, with a separate doc for each. The leasing doc will be cleared on August 31st each year (as indicated on the website) and club leases for the following season will be offered in order of first come first served to names added from September 1st onwards. The interested to purchase list will not be cleared without reaching out to those individuals first to check their continued interest.
